

PROGRAM SET FOR ST. BONAVENTURE

As this first newsletter goes to press, the fourth ITMS General Meeting, is a mere nine months away, June 15-18, 1995, at St. Bonaventure in Olean, New York. The program and schedule was finalized and approved by your ITMS Program Committee this past

June at the Thomas Merton Center in Louisville. A rich and diverse program schedule it is! Under the unifying theme 'SUMMONED TO EXPLORE - MERTON'S PROPHETIC HEART CHALLENGE'. Highlights include the springboard address of Lawrence S. Cunningham, chair of the Theology Department of Notre Dame, a presentation entitled "A Message to Poets Reconsidered-Reflections on a Merton Manifesto" A Merton scholar, Prof. Cunningham is a frequent contributor to the Cistercian Studies Quarterly, and well known to Merton audiences from his book "Thomas Merton: Spiritual Master" (Paulist Press 1992).

Keynote addresses will be offered by Michael Mott, Esther deWaal, and Fr. James Conner, who will also tender the Presidential Address at Thursday's sumptuous banquet dinner.

The program will include such general subject headings as **EDITING** THE MERTON LETTERS; MERTON & INNER TRUTH; MERTON AND THE ENVIRONMENT; MERTON & YOUNG **MERTON** AND EAST-WEST PEOPLE: CONVERSATION; MERTON & LITERATURE; MERTON & THE SCRIPTURES; MERTON IN OUR DREAMS AND POETRY; MERTON AND INNER AND THEOLOGIANS: **MERTON** MERTON: **TEACHING** TRANSFORMATION; MERTON'S SECULAR JOURNAL; MERTON AT ST. BONAVENTURE; MERTON AND ART; EROS AND AGAPE.

An Open Session entitled WHAT MERTON'S PROPHETIC CHALLENGE MEANS TO ME will invite general audience participation. On Thursday a shuttle will take us to Merton's "Writing Cottage" - plus a walking tour to "Merton's Heart". Meditation/Prayer periods have also been worked into the schedule. There will be entertainment Thursday evening and a reception and entertainment Saturday evening.

FIFTH VOLUME OF MERTON LETTERS READY THIS SEPT.

The compilation and editing of the fifth volume of the Merton letters has been completed by Msgr. Bill Shannon and is scheduled to reach the book shelves this September, published by Farrar, Straus & Giroux. The volume is entitled "WITNESS TO FREEDOM; LETTERS IN TIMES OF CRISES". This latest collection of Merton letters contains many of the unpublished "cold war" letters and letters dealing with the issue of war. Letters to Naomi Burton Stone, Louis Massignon are included, as well as an exchange of letters between Merton and Fr. Raymond (best known for "The Man Who Got Even With God"). Merton signed his letters "Louisy" (pronounced 'lousy') while Fr. Raymond signed his letters 'Rasputin'. Your editor vividly remembers Fr. Raymond as something of a human dynamo who gave the impression that, when his time came, he would barge into heaven with a battering ram, sweeping St. Peter aside in the process!



NEW MERTON JOURNALS

As some of us are aware, Bro. Patrick Hart is general editor of the Merton Journals, estimated at seven volumes. The first volume being edited by Brother Pat contains material from two little known journals (including the Cuban Journal) that have been housed at St. Bonaventure these many years. This first volume is expected to appear sometime in 1995, hopefully before the June 1995 General Meeting, Brother Pat informs us that all seven of the Merton Journals are now in some stage of processing, with the first three near completion. The plan is to publish these journals a year apart, one journal a year. As of this writing, no publisher has yet been selected. (See Brother Pat's article "The Journals of Thomas Merton" in The Merton Seasonal, Vol 18, Nos 3 & 4, 1993). Based on a conversation with Brother Pat while I was at Gethsemani following the June Board meeting, it is my understanding that, with the publication of the seven journals, no chronological gap will exist in Merton's journal writings.

1996 SUMMER RETREATS

At the June Board meeting, Pat O'Connell put forth the suggestion for ITMS members to organize regional retreats during the off-year between the general meetings, employing the theme of the previous year's meeting. The idea was unanimously accepted. At this writing, eight regional sites have been selected along with facilitators who can be contacted for further information. The 1996 summer retreats will carry over the theme: "Summoned to Explore the Heart: Thomas Merton's Prophetic Challenge". More complete information on the retreats, including additional regional sites, will appear in the next issue of HERMITAGE.
