PUBLICATIONS BY AND ABOUT THOMAS MERTON


We continue with this SEASONAL to provide a running bibliography of materials by and about Thomas Merton which have been acquisitioned by the Thomas Merton Studies Center.

The most significant publication by Merton which we list here is the monumental (nearly 600 pages) THE LITERARY ESSAYS OF THOMAS MERTON, more fully described on pages 4-6. Edited by the indefatigible Brother Patrick Hart, this collection gathers together all of Merton's critical essays about literary figures, reviews, his Master's essay on Blake, and transcriptions of some talks. One interesting item is Merton's only surviving review of a play, the previously unpublished "The Trial of Pope Pius XII," a review of Rolf Hochhuth's *The Deputy*. Published by New Directions, this volume makes a fitting companion piece to the similarly bound THE COLLECTED POEMS OF THOMAS MERTON.

In 1981 the Thomas Merton Studies Center acted as receiving agent for a grant from the Kentucky Arts Commission to tape the NILES-MERTON SONG CYCLE. John Jacob Niles, Kentucky folk singer and composer, set twenty-two of Merton's poems and translations to music (cf. MERTON SEASONAL 6 (Winter-Spring 1981): no. 1, pp. 6-7). The entire cycle was recorded with the aid of the grant and is now available on cassette tape from Mark Foster Music Company. The tape is accompanied by an attractive Song Book which makes the Niles score available commercially for the first time. Further details are given on page 10.

Of the publications about Merton, two are noteworthy. Anthony T. Padovano's study of Merton, which draws extensively on unpublished sources in the Thomas Merton Studies Center, THE HUMAN JOURNEY: THOMAS MERTON, SYMBOL OF A CENTURY, has been published by Doubleday and Company. St. Anthony Messenger Press is now publishing a series of books for children in their "Young People's Library of Famous American Catholics." The Merton volume, written by David R. Collins, has several appealing drawings by Mary Beth Froehlich which accompany the text. The cover drawing is reproduced as the cover of this SEASONAL.

Three articles on Merton's approach to the question of non-violence are listed here, articles by David Givey, Valerie Turner, and Gordon Zahn. Several articles comparing Merton to other recent figures are included in this listing: Sigmund Freud (Thayer); Karl Barth (de Jong); Jacques Maritain (Bruteau and Zahn); Flannery O'Connor (Fitzgerald); and Karl Rahner (Kress). These articles and the new study by Tony Padovano represent various attempts to place Merton in the context of his time and to assess his contributions in relation to other major figures.
