PUBLICATIONS BY AND ABOUT THOMAS MERTON

We continue with this SEASONAL to provide a running bibliography of materials by and about Thomas Merton which have been recently published and/or acquisitioned by the Thomas Merton Studies Center.

One more Merton work has been set to music, this time one of the stories from THE WISDOM OF THE DESERT. Sister Vera Lea Virant, O.C.D., of the Cleveland Carmel, has written music for Story LXII and performs it on the recording issued by the ACS Music Publishing Company. An attractive song book which includes "Desert Father Story" is also available. Both recording and book are titled THE LORD IS MY SONG.


Dr. Cyrus Lee (whose name in Chinese is Li Shao-kun), currently a member of the Psychology and Counseling Department at Edinboro State College in Pennsylvania, visited the Thomas Merton Studies Center in March on his return from Asia. Dr. Lee has kindly given the Center materials published in Taiwan, including two articles "Thomas Merton and Zen Buddhism" and "Life, death and reincarnation: a comparative study of Hanshan Tzu and Thomas Merton," which appeared in the journal CHINESE CULTURE (Taipei). Of note is Dr. Lee's book, MI ER DONG YU CH'AN TAO, which contains two articles by Dr. Lee and translations of essays by and about Merton. These materials, now included in our files, indicate further the international scope of Merton's influence.

In the current issue of CISTERCIAN STUDIES, Alan Gilmore has done a "re-view," a retrospective look at Merton's early hagiography, WHAT ARE THESE WOUNDS? He attempts to reassess this out-of-print work, one which Merton himself rated "Awful" in his 1967 evaluation of his own books, and to appraise its place in the Merton career. Gilmore concludes that this biography of Saint Lutgarde, a Cistercian mystic, is not all that bad, is worthy of re-examination, and should not simply be dismissed in a study of the Merton corpus.

Two major publications by Anthony Padovano have been published this year. His book-length study, THE HUMAN JOURNEY: THOMAS MERTON, SYMBOL OF A CENTURY, has been called "remarkable" by Brother Patrick Hart; "fresh and new" by Basil Pennington; and "engaging" by George MacRae. In addition a series of lectures by Dr. Padovano, titled THOMAS MERTON: A LIFE FOR OUR TIMES, has been published by NCR Cassettes on 12 tapes. This lecture series is more fully described on p. 10 and in our bibliographic listings.

Finally, two major Merton works have appeared in new translations --- a severely abridged Spanish version of CONTEMPLATION IN A WORLD OF ACTION and an Hungarian edition of THE SEVEN STOREY MOUNTAIN, the third Merton book to be translated into Hungarian officially and circulated in Hungary.


