This previously unpublished poem is found in a reading notebook, now at the Syracuse University Library, from August-September, 1966, a period when Merton was reading extensively in French existentialism; the title is loosely translated within the poem itself; the reference to the "mineral water President" is presumably to Marshal Pétain, head of the collaborationist Vichy government during World War II.
